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# YOUR JOINING INSTRUCTIONS





Welcome to Buckinghamshire New University!

We are looking forward to you joining our **BSc (Hons) Criminology** course.

At BNU we pride ourselves on the support we offer our students to succeed in their academic learning and creating graduates ready for employment. This information pack has been created by the BNU Welcome Team and your course leader, Dr Keelin Howard, to provide you with information that you will need for a successful start at BNU. Please read it carefully before you join us.

### **STARTING AT BNU**

Our Induction programme will take place in-person at our High Wycombe campus on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> January 2024. Please plan to be on-campus for each of these days from 9am until 5pm.

### **ENROLMENT**

You need to enrol online with BNU before you join us. You will receive an email giving you all the information you need, so don't worry. More information can be found on our <u>website</u> and we have included a <u>handy checklist</u> to make sure you cover everything.

### **ID / Qualifications Check**

You will be required to show proof of ID when you start with us. This can be:

- Current passport
- EU / EEA National Identity Card
- Birth / Adoption certificate

You will also require proof of your qualifications. Please make sure you have these documents available prior to joining us.

### **Photograph**

You will need to email us a head and shoulders photograph of yourself before you start at BNU. This photo should be in a JPEG format and sent to <a href="mailto:students@bnu.ac.uk">students@bnu.ac.uk</a> with the subject line "Student ID." Please include the following information in your email:

- Your student ID (if you know it)
- Your full name (include all forenames and surname)
- Your date of birth
- The name of the course you will be starting





### **ABOUT YOUR COURSE**

Welcome to studying one of our Criminology degree programmes!

Your first year will involve learning the basics and gaining a foundation of knowledge in criminology, including the main explanations for crime and understanding the workings of the criminal justice system in the UK. Criminology is a social science, so in your first year you will learn how social science can provide us with key insights about crime, criminal justice and related issues, and how to see and think using a social science lens on the social world. All of our programmes involve applying your learning in the classroom to current real world criminological and social issues and you will find your course highly relevant to the contemporary world of work in and around criminal justice.

In your second year you will have the opportunity to choose one of our exciting pathways, depending on your interests and career goals. You could choose to take the Criminology and Forensic Studies pathway in which, alongside criminology modules, you would study Forensic Studies with a former CSI from the Met Police, learning the skills and competencies necessary to work either as a CSI or a more general forensics setting.

Alternatively, you could choose our Criminology and Law pathway, in which you would study law modules alongside criminology; an ideal pathway for anyone who wishes to work in and around the legal profession. Of course, if you would prefer a more in-depth exploration of criminology and this suits your career goals, you could also specialise in Criminology throughout your three years with us.


